Candles

The ritual and elemental atmosphere of candles is not comparable to any other item of interior decoration.

This unique effect is further heightened when the decorative look is supplemented by the sensuous component of fragrance.

The candles for the Lambert collection are manufactured by a family-run business on the Lower Rhine, which has poured and pressed candles in a variety of shapes and colours for almost a century. Lambert offers them in a wide range of organic shades that will harmonize wonderfully with any ambience. The more voluminous candles, in particular, have a distinct

object character that unfurls its unmistakable effect even when the candles are unlit.

Lambert has designed a series of candleholders for all shapes to emphasize the decorative qualities of the respective candle form.

Safety

The church candles featuring in the Lambert collection undergo RAL checking to ensure vested quality that is not injurious to health. RAL is a protection of trade mark which means: select choice of raw materials (good burning quality), tested wicks (soot production is reduced to a minimum) and examination of all ingredients in order to ensure the consumers' health and the protection of the environment.

Care

Certain rules must be observed if one wishes to enjoy candles for as long as possible without interruption: Lambert candles are smoke- and soot-free. Depending on the diameter and the height they will burn for many hours, provided that they stand in a draught-free place and the wick is always kept short. In addition, the burning pool must be kept clean and the wick always straightened up before lighting.



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Do not leave any bits of matches, pieces of wick or any other impurity in the area around the wick. The ideal length of the wick is 10 to 15 mm. A wick exceeding this length will produce black smoke - if necessary, shorten it carefully with a pair of scissors before each lighting. All large-diameter candles should be allowed to burn until the entire burning pool is filled with melted wax - otherwise the rim will be too high. We recommend to cut it off, whilst it is still hot. Do not burn square candles with four wicks for more than 2,5 hours, because melted wax could break through the side walls.



Large-dimensioned church candles should burn at least until the entire area around the wick is liquefied. Otherwise the candle will burn down hollow. If you dip the wick into liquid wax to extinguish it and immediately restraighten it, it will not continue to glow and is in the correct position to be lit.

Safety Instructions

Never leave candles unattended or alone with little children! Candles must be placed in a way that they cannot tip over while burning. They dislike being arranged in too close clusters, when burning. Therefore make sure that there is a sufficiently large space between the single candles!

Avoid placing candles in a draught, for in this case they start to produce black smoke, drip and burn down unevenly. If you notice increasing production of black smoke, please check if there is a draught in the room and/or shorten the wick. If needs be, extinguish the flame.

Do not damage the rim of the candle, because otherwise liquid wax will leak out.
