Rugs

The zenith of wall-to-wall carpeting has been exceeded and nowadays skilled parquet floor layers are working overtime. Old parquet floors are no longer being concealed beneath velvet-pile carpet. To guarantee an appealing décor, however, it must be adorned by a classic rug. In combination with beautiful parquet or stone, the latter is experiencing a renaissance. On a plain floor rugs are once again able to serve their purpose. Rugs build bridges, they give structure to a room and create islands upon which fantasies can be fulfilled.



Lambskin Rugs

This new enthusiasm for rugs is reflected in Lambert's lambskin rugs. They are made of a traditional material in a new interpretation and up-to-date colours. As present-day descendants of the "Flokati" culture that gave rise to a generation of floor-sitters in the 1970s, they are an ideal match for chromium and wood in either urban or rustic

surroundings.



Workmanship

The lambskins employed by Lambert originate in Inner Mongolia. Each rug is handmade from lots of individual pieces and robustly sewn. Their underside is reinforced and rugs come with an anti-skid lattice. Depending on its size, each Taiga rug is composed of approx. 30 to 40 individual skins. Each rug is unique. Minor variations in colour and size are therefore possible. Different material thicknesses and slight loss of hair might occur with this kind of natural skin rugs. However, these effects are typical features of this material.

Care

We recommend to plump up the rug occasionally to redress the lambskin. The rug should also be beaten in regular intervals. Light-coloured and white skins must not be exposed to direct sunlight, because otherwise they might go yellow. Stains must be removed immediately: Do not rub, but instead dab with a white, damp cloth and let dry. Lambskin rugs should neither be washed nor vacuum-cleaned, because the hair of the natural skin, which has not been firmly knotted, might get loose. If your rug is soiled, you must give it to the dry cleaner's. In any case it should only be cleaned by a specialist.

Rugs made of Virgin Wool



High-pile carpets fascinate by their play with exceptional surfaces and structures. Charming contrasts are the outcome of the use of special yarns. The noble woollen carpets featuring in the Lambert collection with their manyfold colour combinations set the scene in any decorative setting.

Workmanship

All woollen carpets featuring in the collection are handmade of high-grade New Zealand virgin wool and furnished with a textile underside. Apart from various standard sizes, customized dimensions are possible upon request.

Care

Thanks to the many good properties of wool, woollen carpets are easy to care for. Vacuum-clean your carpet once or twice a week. Please use a smooth nozzle, a brush or shake vacuum cleaner on loop pile carpets. The "fluff" which is typical of new carpets is production-related and is not a defect. Fluff is nothing but frayed fibre endings which disappear after you have vacuum-cleaned the carpet a few times. We recommend a thorough cleaning of your carpet every two or three years by specialist cleaners.
